The City's existing Criminal Activity Ordinance has proven to be very helpful to the Code Enforcement department, the Police department, and landlords. The amendments to be made will provide an even bigger benefit to the departments.

Some issues have been identified that necessitate amending the ordinance which will enable staff to enforce the codes beyond conducting repeated inspections.*

AMENDED FEES FOR INSPECTION AND RE-INSPECTION OF RENTAL DWELLING UNITS, PROVIDE FOR SUSPENSION OF A RENTAL DWELLING LICENSE WHERE A PROPERTY OWNER FAILS TO SCHEDULE A RE-INSPECTION, AMEND THE METHODS OF SERVICE OF NOTICES AND ORDERS, AND DESIGNATE RENTING WITHOUT A RENTAL DWELLING LICENSE AS A CLASS B MISDEMEANOR, AND AMENDING CHAPTER 110 OF THE COVINGTON CODE OF ORDINANCES TO REPEAL DUPLICATE PROVISIONS. *Some issues have been identified that necessitate this amendment to the current ordinance relating to Fire Inspections. The amendments will include provisions that will provide a basis for enforcement of the codes beyond conducting repeated inspections.*
