

**MINUTES**  
**BOARD OF COMMISSIONERS' MEETING**  
**Tuesday, January 7, 2014 6:00 P.M.**  
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A **REGULAR MEETING** of the Board of Commissioners of the City of Covington, Kentucky, was opened by Mayor Carran, on Tuesday, January 7, 2014, at 6:00 p.m., in Commission Chambers, 20 West Pike Street, Covington, Kentucky.

Mayor Carran presiding with Commissioners Chuck Eilerman, Steve Frank, Mildred Rains, Michelle Williams, City Manager Larry Klein, and City Solicitor Frank Warnock, present.

**MOTION** of Commissioner Rains, seconded by Commissioner Williams to dispense with the reading of and approve the minutes of the December 17, 2013, meeting minutes.

**Passed.** 5 Yeas. Commissioners Eilerman, Frank, Rains, Williams, and Mayor Carran.

**PRESENTATIONS:**

Jenni Miller Francis of the Center for Great Neighborhoods introduced the current members of the Covington Youth Commission. Mayor Carran then administered the Oath of Office to the members.

**NEW POSITION LEGAL DEPARTMENT** – The Ordinance will create and establish the salary for the position of Senior Law Clerk in the Legal Department.

AN ORDER/RESOLUTION APPROVING THE EMPLOYMENT OF J. CHRISTIAN DENNERLY AS SENIOR LAW CLERK, CONTINGENT ON SUCCESSFUL COMPLETION OF EMPLOYMENT REQUIREMENTS, EFFECTIVE JANUARY 7, 2014.

**SALE OF VACANT PROPERTIES** – In 2009, the City of Covington signed a commitment letter for the Jacob Prices Homes HOPE VI Revitalization application stating in part: "The City commits to providing HAC with options to purchase, at nominal cost, 34 City-owned properties in the East Side Neighborhood for developing these parcels as affordable homeownership units as part of the HOPE VI revitalization program" Phase IV is the final phase of the HOPE VI application and is focused on promoting homeownership adjacent to and surrounding Rivers Edge.

**COMMISSIONERS' ORDER/RESOLUTION NO. O/R-04-14**

AN ORDER/RESOLUTION AUTHORIZING THE MAYOR AND CITY MANAGER TO EXECUTE AN OPTION TO PURCHASE WITH THE HOUSING AUTHORITY OF COVINGTON FOR SEVEN CITY-OWNED PROPERTIES LOCATED ON EAST 10<sup>TH</sup> STREET AND EAST ROBBINS STREET, AS WELL AS ANY RELATED DOCUMENTS.

Commissioner Frank abstained.

**LEASE CANCELLATION** – The City of Covington and Scott Street Land Company, Inc. entered into a lease agreement in 1992. Bonds were issued for the cost of acquisition, construction, equipping and installation of facilities for downtown revitalization, and to improve the economic development of downtown Covington. All of the terms of the lease have been satisfied and the lease can be cancelled.

AN ORDER/RESOLUTION CANCELLING A LEASE BETWEEN THE CITY OF COVINGTON AND SCOTT STREET LAND COMPANY, LLLP, f/k/a SCOTT STREET LAND COMPANY, LTS., A KENTUCKY LIMITED LIABILITY LIMITED PARTNERSHIP IN REGARD TO THE LEASE OF REAL PROPERTY LOCATED AT 301-333 SCOTT BOULEVARD, COVINGTON, KENTUCKY, AND COMMONLY REFERRED TO AS THE GATEWAY CENTER IN SATISFACTION OF THE LEASE CONDITIONS.

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**EMERY DRIVE APARTMENTS REAL ESTATE PARCEL** – This O/R will allow the sale of a vacant single family home on property owned by the Neighborhood Investment Partners (NIP) to a buyer who will improve and occupy the building and return it to the City's property tax rolls. In addition, the proceeds of the sale will allow NIP to reduce its mortgage with the Cincinnati Development Fund.

**COMMISSIONERS' ORDER/RESOLUTION NO. O/R-06-14**

AN ORDER/RESOLUTION AUTHORIZING THE RELEASE OF A MORTGAGE INTEREST IN AN EMERY DRIVE APARTMENTS PARCEL OF REAL ESTATE TO ALLOW FOR THE SALE OF THE PARCEL TO A THIRD PARTY.

**PURCHASE CAMERAS POLICE DEPARTMENT** – Five bids were received for these cameras and Reveal Media submitted the most responsible bid. The body-worn cameras will provide evidence in both criminal and administrative matters.

AN ORDER/RESOLUTION ACCEPTING THE BID OF REVEAL MEDIA FOR THE PURCHASE OF 80 RUGGEDIZED BODY WORN CAMERAS IN AN AMOUNT OF \$49,243.90, AS THE BEST RESPONSIBLE BID, \$25,000.00 DONATED BY JOHN TOPITS THAT WILL BE PAYABLE FROM GENERAL FUND, AND \$24,243.90 PAYABLE FROM ASSET FORFEITURE FUND.

In order for the City to no longer have to maintain the building, the intent is to close on the transfer as soon as due diligence has occurred.

**REVOCABLE LICENSE AGREEMENT** – Mr. Pelini, a resident of Mutter Gottes, has requested to install a "little library" on City property for use by the neighborhood and other residents. The Little Library concept is a free book exchange where people can put in a book and take out a book to read. The structure has been constructed to be sympathetic to the surrounding neighborhood and will be installed and maintained by Mr. Pelini.

**TEXT AMENDMENT** – A prospective business owner is looking to open an indoor smart car/smart bike retail shop in a vacant commercial storefront located within the CBD. The business was unable to locate in the CBD because the use type, New Vehicle & Equipment Sales, Light, is a prohibited use type in the CBD. The prospective business owner has stated their business will not require or include outdoor storage or display of merchandise nor will have any on-site maintenance or repair for items sold.
