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A **REGULAR MEETING** of the Board of Commissioners of the City of Covington, Kentucky, was opened by Mayor Carran, on Tuesday, June 10, 2014, at 6:00 p.m., in Commission Chambers, 20 West Pike Street, Covington, Kentucky.

Mayor Carran presiding with Commissioners Chuck Eilerman, Steve Frank, Mildred Rains, Michelle Williams, City Manager Larry Klein, and City Solicitor Frank Warnock, present.

MOTION of Commissioner Rains, seconded by Commissioner Eilerman to dispense with the reading of and approve the minutes of the May 27, 2014, meeting minutes.

Public Hearing:

2014 TAX AND REVENUE ANTICIPATION NOTES

COMMISSIONERS' ORDINANCE NO. O-09-14

AN ORDINANCE AUTHORIZING THE ISSUANCE OF 2014 TAX AND REVENUE ANTICIPATION NOTES; APPROVING A FORM OF NOTE; AUTHORIZING DESIGNATED OFFICERS TO EXECUTE AND DELIVER THE NOTE; AUTHORIZING AND DIRECTING THE FILING OF NOTICE WITH THE STATE LOCAL DEBT OFFICER; PROVIDING FOR THE PAYMENT AND SECURITY OF THE NOTES; APPOINTING A PAYING AGENT AND REGISTRAR; CREATING A SINKING FUND; MAKING CERTAIN FEDERAL INCOME TAX COVENANTS IN RESPECT OF THE NOTES; ACCEPTING THE PROPOSAL OF THE NOTE PURCHASER HEREINAFTER SETTING FORTH FOR THE PURCHASE OF THE NOTES; AND REPEALING INCONSISTENT ORDINANCES, RESOLUTIONS AND ORDERS.

HISTORIC COVINGTON DESIGN GUIDELINES – The original Historic Covington Design Guidelines were written in 1988 and have had several updates over the years. As technologies, methods, and materials in the historic preservation field have changed there is a need to incorporate and change the guidelines to reflect these changes.

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COMMISSIONERS' ORDINANCE NO. O-10-14

AN ORDINANCE ADOPTING THE UPDATED HISTORIC COVINGTON DESIGN GUIDELINES AS APPROVED BY THE URBAN DESIGN REVIEW BOARD.

RENTAL FEES – As part of the FY15 budget process, an increase in park shelter rental fees for residents and non-residents has been recommended. The increase will generate an additional \$2,500 annually for the City's General Fund, and help to defray the costs of maintaining Devou Park and other parks in the City.

COMMISSIONERS' ORDINANCE NO. O-12-14

AN ORDINANCE AMENDING § 34.50 OF THE COVINGTON CODE OF ORDINANCES, NON-UNIFORMED, NON-CIVIL SERVICE EMPLOYEES, POSITIONS DESIGNATED AND ORDINANCE O-27-13, NON-UNION CLASSIFICATION SYSTEM, ELIMINATING THE POSITION OF ADMINISTRATIVE ASSISTANT TO THE ADMINISTRATION DEPARTMENT.

NEW BUSINESS – ORDER/RESOLUTIONS

SANITATION DISTRICT NO.1 – SD1 is currently accepting public comment through June 13th on its proposed budget and rate increase for FY 2015. This O/R reflects the City's suggested policy to SD1 that any rate increases approved re dedicated to addressing public health and safety, and property damage issues related to combined sewer overflows that have occurred in Covington over the past four years, instead of rate increases being allocated for expansion of the current system to serve new development.

COMMISSIONER'S ORDER/RESOLUTION NO. O/R-119-14

AN ORDER/RESOLUTION OF THE BOARD OF COMMISSIONERS OF THE CITY OF COVINGTON, KENTON COUNTY, KENTUCKY, RELATING TO THE SANITARY AND STORM SEWER SYSTEM OWNED AND OPERATED BY THE SANITATION DISTRICT NO. 1 OF NORTHERN KENTUCKY (SD1) AND THE DESIGN CONSTRUCTION AND FUNDING OF NECESSARY IMPROVEMENTS THEREOF TO REDUCE THE THREAT TO PUBLIC HEALTH, SAFETY AND PROPERTY.

HOMELAND SECURITY GRANT – FIRE DEPARTMENT – The grant requires a resolution approving the execution of documents necessary to move forward with the grant process. The replacement of these items will be paid by the City with 100 reimbursement from the Kentucky Office of Homeland Security.

AN ORDER/RESOLUTION AUTHORIZING THE MAYOR TO EXECUTE AN APPLICATION WITH THE KENTUCKY OFFICE OF HOMELAND SECURITY FOR A GRANT FOR THE POLICE DEPARTMENT TO BE USED FOR EQUIPMENT AND PHYSICAL IMPROVEMENT PROJECTS AT POLICE HEADQUARTERS.

EDWARD BYRNE MEMORIAL JUSTICE ASSISTANCE GRANT – The required public hearing was conducted at the start of this meeting by Col. Jones who briefed the public and Commission on the specifics of the budget items. The budget items submitted include a Dell PowerEdge Server, associated server licenses, nine Apple iPads and associated protective cases.

AN ORDER/RESOLUTION APPROVING THE 2014 EDWARD BYRNE MEMORIAL JUSTICE ASSISTANCE GRANT BUDGET ITEMS AS SUBMITTED BY THE COVINGTON POLICE DEPARTMENT.

CONTRACT FINANCE DEPARTMENT SOFTWARE – This upgrade brings existing financial systems up to date with current architecture, processing and controls. The upgrade facilitates more efficient and improved processes in the Finance Department benefiting all other departments through enriched data management and reporting.

AN ORDER/RESOLUTION APPROVING A CONTRACT WITH SPRINGBROOK SOFTWARE, INC., FORMERLY DOING BUSINESS AS KVS INFORMATION SYSTEMS, INC., FOR THE CONVERSION AND INSTALLATION OF THE FINANCE DEPARTMENT SOFTWARE IN A TOTAL AMOUNT OF \$332,917.00, TO BE DISBURSED OVER A FIVE YEAR PERIOD, AND AUTHORIZING THE MAYOR AND CITY MANAGER TO ENTER INTO ALL NECESSARY CONTRACTS WITH SPRINGBROOK SOFTWARE, INC.
