

## Enforcement

Enforcement activities will be conducted by ABM, the parking contractor for the City of Covington. They will have data regarding who has purchased parking permits and the ability to verify same.

## Public Parking

Below is a list of available public parking. Dates and times listed are hours of enforcement. Specific rates and time restrictions are posted at each lot and garage.

- On-street meters (M-F, 9-5)
- Suspension Bridge Lot (M-F, 9-5)
- Mike Fink Lot (M-F, 9-5)
- Covington Landing Lot (M-F, 9-5)
- Rivercenter Garage (24/7)
- Kenton County Garage (24/7)
- Mid-Town Garage (24/7)
- City Center Parking Garage (24/7)

Residential Permits are not valid for the City of Covington Garages, Surface Lots or Parking Meters.

## What do I need to bring?

You must bring verification of residency. That could be any of the following items, which establish your address within the boundaries of the program area:

- Recent Utility Bill
- Lease or Deed

## How much will my permit cost?

A Residential Parking Permit cost \$25 each annually, and this will include one annual visitor pass. Residents are limited to two parking permits and two visitor passes each year.

## Residential Parking Program Area

The boundaries for the parking permits are Eighth St. north to the Ohio River and the north/south alley between Scott Blvd. and Greenup St. east to the Licking River.

This is an optional program in which residents who reside within the boundaries of the program area may or may not elect to participate.

### Permit Information

Residential Parking Permits will be available on an annual basis to residents of the Parking Program Area for \$25 each, which will include one visitor pass. There is a maximum of two permits and two visitor passes per household, per year. These passes are valid for the calendar year in which they are issued, renewable annually, and will be linked to each resident/address for police verification purposes.

Permits will be window stickers, which should be placed in the rear window on the driver's side of the resident's vehicle.



Residents who do not purchase Resident Parking Permits must comply with on-street signage requirements.

## Visitor Passes

One visitor pass will be provided with each Residential Parking Permit. These will be hang-tag style that can hook onto the rear-view mirror of visitor cars. If these passes are abused or misused, they may be revoked. There is a replacement charge of \$25 for any lost or stolen visitor passes.



### Signage

There will be signs as you are entering the neighborhood advising drivers that they are entering a residential parking zone.



Signs within the neighborhood will be one of the following, based on the zones listed as follows:

#### Zone 1

Riverside Dr. west of Garrard St.

“Residential Parking By Permit Only”



#### Zone 2

Riverside Dr. and the east Side of Garrard St. around George Rogers Clark Park

“Two Hour Parking 7:00 AM to 6:00 PM”



#### Zone 3

Remainder of neighborhood:

“Two Hour Parking 7 AM - 6 PM Except By Permit”



#### Zone 4

The east side of the 600 block of Greenup St.

“Three Hour Parking 7 AM - 9 PM Except By Permit”



#### Zone 5

Eighth St. from the Licking River to the alley between Greenup St. & Scott

“Three Hour Parking 12 PM - 3 PM Except By Permit”
