EXECUTIVE ORDER CITY OF COVINGTON, KENTUCKY

EXECUTIVE ORDER NO. 2020-EO-02

WHEREAS, on March 19, 2020, Mayor Joseph U. Meyer signed Executive Order 2020-EO-01, declaring a state of emergency in the City of Covington due to the outbreak of COVID-19 virus, a public health emergency; and

WHEREAS, applicable Kentucky laws authorize a mayor to exercise emergency powers to efficiently and effectively provide for the health, safety and welfare of citizens.

NOW and therefore, I, Joseph U. Meyer, pursuant to the authority vested in me as Mayor of the City of Covington, Kentucky by KRS Chapter 39A, KRS 39B, and in furtherance of the declaration set forth in Executive Order 2020-EO-01, hereby order:


That Assistant City Manager Bruce M. Applegate, Jr. is appointed the City of Covington's Coronavirus Response Coordinator for the duration of this emergency. Mr. Applegate will serve as the point of contact for members of the public, government officials, City staff, and others. He will also serve as an additional liaison for relevant local government agencies such as the Northern Kentucky Health Department and Kenton County Homeland Security and Emergency Management. He will receive, collect and organize all relevant information and documents and work with appropriate staff and officials to prioritize matters for action through subsequent Executive Orders. Mr. Applegate will be responsible for the coordination of all crisis-related information and documents and will ensure there is a common and consistent interpretation for citizens, business owners, officials and staff during this crisis.

It is further ordered that relevant department heads and senior staff will participate in a daily briefing at a time and location scheduled by Mr. Applegate to continue to evaluate all City needs and resources during this emergency.

This Order shall remain in effect until terminated by the issuance of another Executive Order when I determine that a state of emergency no longer exists and the exercise of extraordinary measures are no longer required for the protection of the public health, safety and welfare.

THIS ORDER IS EFFECTIVE MARCH 20, 2020 AND SHALL REMAIN IN EFFECT UNTIL RESCINDED BY EXECUTIVE ORDER.
