Recycle your Christmas tree this holiday season! The City of Covington Department of Public Works - Urban Forestry Division will convert Christmas trees into mulch that can be used for personal gardens, community gardens or neighborhood beautification efforts. ## **Did you know..?**

Every year, roughly 40 million tons of compostable yard waste ends up in the landfill. In the past our Christmas trees have contributed to this number. Recycle your tree this year and help keep landfills small and recycling efforts big.

## **Recycling your tree is easy!**

Do your part to recycle this holiday season and drop-off your trees at any of the following locations from December 28 to January 18.

### **LOCATIONS**

1. South Covington: Parking lot off of Tripoli and Hands Pike, adjacent to the neighborhood park.
2. Devou Park: Urban Forestry Garage, 1700 Montague Road
3. Downtown: Parking lot located underneath the Suspension Bridge off of Greenup Street.

### **GUIDELINES**

1. Remove lights, ornaments, tinsel and all other decorations from tree.
2. Do not place tree in plastic bag.

### **SCHEDULE CURBSIDE COLLECTION**

From January 4 through January 18, Rumpke Waste & Recycling will pick up trees on the same day as trash collection.
