A RESOLUTION NAMING THE BASKETBALL COURT AT RANDOLPH PARK 'JAMES BROCK COURT' AND THE SHELTER AT RANDOLPH PARK 'DAVID HOUSLEY SHELTER'.

WHEREAS, James Brock served as the head basketball coach at William Grant High School in Covington Kentucky from 1955 until the closing of the school in 1965; and

WHEREAS, during his tenure as a basketball coach at William Grant High School, Mr. Brock played a significant role in impacting the lives of numerous Covington youth; and

WHEREAS, Mr. Brock's numerous achievements as a coach resulted in his induction into the Northern Kentucky Black Hall of Fame and the KHSAA Hall of Fame in the year 2000, demonstrating his great significance to the community; and

WHEREAS, Mr. Housley has been a community activist and leader for many years; and

WHEREAS, Mr. Housley managed the Randolph Pool for over 30 years; and

WHEREAS, the Old Timers event, held at Randolph Park, was founded by Mr. Housley and is an annual event that brings families and friends from all over the country together; and

WHEREAS, the Covington Board of Commissioners wish to honor Mr. Brock and Mr. Housley's countless contributions to the City of Covington by naming certain features of Randolph Park in their honor.

NOW, THEREFORE,  
BE IT RESOLVED BY THE BOARD OF COMMISSIONERS OF THE CITY OF COVINGTON, KENTON COUNTY, KENTUCKY:

Section 1

That the Board of Commissioners hereby name the basketball court at Randolph Park "James Brock Court" and the shelter at Randolph Park "David Housley Shelter" and thank them for their many contributions to the City and its residents.

That this resolution shall take effect and be in full force when passed and recorded according to law.
