WHEREAS, Covington Catholic High School was founded in 1925 and had its first home on Sixth Street in Covington; and

WHEREAS, Covington Catholic High School Colonels defeated Scott County 73-55 to win the 101st Kentucky High School Athletic Association Boys' Sweet Sixteen Basketball State Tournament Championship; and

WHEREAS, Covington Catholic High School became the first Northern Kentucky High School to win two State basketball championships; and

WHEREAS, Covington Catholic High School became only the third high school to win a boys' basketball championship and a football championship in the same school year; and

WHEREAS, the Colonels are coached by Scott Ruthsatz in his seventh season as coach where he has earned an overall record of 200-48 and won two state championships and was ably assisted by Mr. Joe Fredrick, Mr. Brandon Elliot, and Mr. Casey Sorrell; and

WHEREAS, the Colonels were led by CJ Fredrick who shot 63.6% during the tournament and scored 111 points putting him alone in 12th place all time for a single tournament, earned tournament MVP and was named Kentucky's Gatorade Player of the Year; and

WHEREAS the members of the team include Michael Collins, Jack Davin, TJ Deere, Grant Disken, Tyler Fleek, Adam Fortner, CJ Fredrick, Neil Green, AJ Mayer Michael Mayer, Casey Nowak, Aiden Ruthsatz, Luke Thelen, Nick Thelen, and Jake Walter.

Section 1

Chapter 32, Section 32.01 of the Covington Code of Ordinances is hereby amended as follows:

(A) The various departments of the city are hereby established by the Mayor and Board of Commissioners, and the agents, employees, and officers within each department shall perform the various duties as provided by law and city ordinance and the salaries and other compensation of all such employees herein shall all be effective as of [~~January 1, 1996~~] **April 1, 2018**. The administrative functions of the city shall be conducted under the Office of the City Manager and eight departments, to wit:

- (1) [~~Administrative~~] Administration Department.
- (2) Legal Department.
- (3) Economic Development Department.
- (4) Department of Public [~~Improvements~~] Works.
- (5) Finance Department.
- (6) Police Department.
- (7) Fire Department.
- (8) [~~Human Resources~~] Neighborhood Services Department.

(B) The Board of Commissioners of the city, upon the recommendation of the City Manager, may appoint such other agents and employees in the various departments and subdepartments or divisions in the city which they may deem necessary for the efficient and economic conduct of the affairs of the city.

AN ORDINANCE AMENDING CHAPTER 10 OF THE COVINGTON CODE OF ORDINANCES, SECTION 10.16 AMENDMENTS TO CODE; AMENDATORY LANGUAGE, TO SPECIFY THE MANNER IN WHICH ORDINANCES AND MUNICIPAL ORDERS MAY BE AMENDED.

WHEREAS, Covington Ordinance Section 10.16 currently provides guidance on how sections of ordinances may be added, amended or repealed;

WHEREAS, the proposed amendments add additional formatting requirements, specifically requiring the use of bold and italics type for proposed amended or added language, which is consistent with the state legislative process;

WHEREAS, the proposed amendments also clarify the difference between amendments to municipal ordinances and municipal orders.

NOW THEREFORE,
BE IT ORDAINED BY THE BOARD OF COMMISSIONERS OF THE CITY
OF COVINGTON, KENTON COUNTY, KENTUCKY:

Section 1

Section 10.16 of the Covington Code of Ordinances is amended to read as follows:

§ 10.16 AMENDMENTS TO CODE; AMENDATORY LANGUAGE

(A) Any chapter, section, or division amended or added to this code by ordinances passed subsequent to this code may be numbered in accordance with the numbering system of this code and printed for inclusion herein. Any chapter, section, or division repealed by subsequent ordinances may be excluded from this code by omission from reprinted pages. Subsequent ordinances as printed or omitted shall be prima facie evidence of such subsequent ordinances until the Board of Commissioners shall adopt a new code of ordinances.

(B) Ordinances to amend shall set out in full the amended ordinance or section indicating any text that is being added by a single solid line drawn underneath it. The new text shall also be italicized and in bold. Text that is intended to be removed shall be marked at the beginning with an opening bracket and at the end with a closing bracket. The text between the brackets shall be stricken through with a single solid line.

~~(B)~~ **(C)** The following language should be used by the city to amend, add, or repeal a chapter, section, or division:

(1) Section amended:

“Section _____ of the Covington Code of Ordinances is amended to read as follows:”

(2) Section added:

“Section _____, which reads as follows, is added to and amends the Covington Code of Ordinances:”

(3) Section repealed:

“Section _____ of the Covington Code of Ordinances, which reads as follows, is repealed:”

(D) Municipal Orders to be amended shall set out in full the amended order indicating any text that is being added by a single solid line drawn underneath it. The new text shall also be italicized and in bold. Text that is intended to be removed shall be marked at the beginning with an opening bracket and at the end with a closing bracket. The text between the brackets shall be stricken through with a single solid line.

(E) The following language should be used by the city to amend or repeal an Order:

(1) Order amended:

“Order No. _____ is amended to read as follows:”

(2) Order repealed:

“Order No. _____ which reads as follows, is repealed:”

AN ORDINANCE AMENDING CHAPTER 111 OF THE COVINGTON CODE OF ORDINANCES, SECTION 111.024 [RESERVED], ESTABLISHING AN ENTERTAINMENT DESTINATION CENTER TO AID ECONOMIC GROWTH AND TOURISM IN THE CITY.

* * * *

WHEREAS, an "Entertainment Destination Center" or "EDC" license allows consumption of alcoholic beverages in public places within the boundaries of the EDC. There are currently three EDC's in the state: Fourth Street Live (Louisville), Newport on the Levy (Newport), and The Summit at Fritz Farm (Lexington);

WHEREAS, an EDC area acts as an overlay or umbrella within which businesses or residences may be located. It is permissible to take alcoholic drinks out of restaurants or bars within the EDC into the common areas and into other ABC licensed premises within the EDC area;

WHEREAS, Rivercenter Entertainment Venues, LLC currently owns and operates FIRE, Butler's Pantry, and Biscuits to Burgers in the City and would like to apply for an EDC license with the state ABC to allow their patrons and customers to move freely between these businesses and throughout the plaza area directly south of the Rivercenter towers at a new EDC area to be named "Piazza at Rivercenter";

WHEREAS, state ABC regulations require the local jurisdiction to pass an ordinance: 1. Determining an EDC licensed premises would aid economic growth and tourism in the county or city; and 2. Defining the geographic boundaries of the EDC; and

WHEREAS, the proposed EDC known as Piazza at Rivercenter would aid economic growth and tourism in the City and the City should establish an ordinance allowing this EDC to be established.

NOW THEREFORE,
BE IT ORDAINED BY THE BOARD OF COMMISSIONERS OF THE CITY
OF COVINGTON, KENTON COUNTY, KENTUCKY:

Section 1

Section 111.024 of the Covington Code of Ordinances is amended to read as follows:

§ 111.024 [~~RESERVED~~]. ENTERTAINMENT DESTINATION CENTERS.

(A) Economic Growth and Tourism. This section is hereby established pursuant to applicable Kentucky laws and regulations regarding an Entertainment Destination Center or "EDC" premises. Pursuant to applicable law, this ordinance confirms that an

Entertainment Destination Center licensed premises would aid economic growth and tourism in the City for the following applicant(s):

(1) Rivercenter Entertainment Venues, LLC dba Piazza at Rivercenter.

(B) Boundaries. Pursuant to applicable Kentucky regulations, geographic boundaries for the following Entertainment Center licensed premises have been identified and are depicted on official drawings and or maps, currently on file with the City ABC Administrator:

(1) Rivercenter Entertainment Venues, LLC dba Piazza at Rivercenter.

AN ORDINANCE REPEALING CHAPTER 113, SECTION 113.01 ESTABLISHMENT OF INCENTIVES, OF THE COVINGTON CODE OF ORDINANCES DUE TO OBSOLESCENCE.

* * * *

WHEREAS, The Kentucky enterprise zone legislation was initially adopted in 1982. It authorized up to 10 zones across the state for a period of 20 years;

WHEREAS, the Covington Code of Ordinances Chapter 113 adopts incentives for an Enterprise Zone;

WHEREAS, legislation to extend the concept, or to extend it under a slightly different name, failed and enterprise zones are no longer authorized by state statute. Covington's enterprise zone expired December 31, 2004; and

WHEREAS, it is recommended to repeal Chapter 113 as part of an ongoing effort to clean up the City's code of ordinances.

NOW THEREFORE,
BE IT ORDAINED BY THE BOARD OF COMMISSIONERS OF THE CITY
OF COVINGTON, KENTON COUNTY, KENTUCKY:

Section 1

Section 113.01 of the Covington Code of Ordinances, which reads as follows, is repealed:

~~§ 113.01 ESTABLISHMENT OF INCENTIVES.~~

~~The following incentives are hereby established for qualifying businesses that locate in the city enterprise zone:~~

~~(A) The city's occupational minimum license filing fee of \$50 is hereby waived.~~

~~(B) The city's occupational license fee of 2½% of net profits is hereby waived for the first three years of business. Notwithstanding the definition of "person" in Chapter 110 of this code, within the enterprise zone, "person" shall be considered an entity which shall include any persons, partnerships, or other entities controlling or controlled by the same persons, partnerships and/or entities that control the qualifying business entity; or officers, directors, partners, employees, limited partners, or person or entities who are otherwise related by business or blood to the same person and/or entities that control the qualifying entity, shall, if the qualifying business entity elects, also be considered part of the qualifying business entity.~~

~~—(C) There is hereby established a moratorium on property taxes as provided by Section 172(B) of the Constitution for a period of five years.~~

~~—(D) The city will rebate 40% of new license fees on salaries, wages, commissions or other compensation earned by every person in the enterprise zone for work done or services performed or rendered in the enterprise zone. The city will rebate the 40% of the license fees to the employer on an annual basis after collection of same. The qualified business will be entitled to this rebate for a five year period from the date of qualification or the date a certificate of occupancy is issued, whichever is later. For the purposes of this incentive, license fees for salaries, wages, commissions or other compensation will be considered to be all new license fees the city receives from a qualified business in excess of the amount received from the same business for the previous 12 months immediately preceding the date of qualification of the business. Businesses that have taken advantage of any Commonwealth of Kentucky incentive program which included a local license fee rebate on salaries, wages, commission or other compensation are not eligible to receive an enterprise zone license fee incentive provided by this section. A business entity that qualified prior to November 1, 1995, may petition the city to receive the aforementioned five year 40% license fee rebate (in lieu of a reduced ad valorem tax on qualified property) if, within an 18 month period after petitioning the city, the business entity increases its capital investment in the enterprise zone by not less than 20% and within the same 18 month period, it creates not less than 25 full time equivalent new jobs in the enterprise zone which are 100% subject to the city license fee.~~

~~—(E) It is hereby established that any application of a qualifying business within an enterprise zone before the Urban Design Review Board shall be considered by the City Commission at the next legislative meeting following the Urban Design Review Board meeting.~~

~~(F) For the purposes of interpretation of this chapter, KRS 154.45-001 to 154.45-009, 154.45-011 to 154.45-049, 154.45-051 to 154.45-059, 154.45-061 to 154.45-069, 154.45-071 to 154.45-089, 154.45-091 to 154.45-109, and 154.45-111 to 154.45-119 shall govern.]~~
