

1 Streetscape Enhancements

Strengthening the linkage between Downtown Covington and the Riverfront along Greenup Street, unified, pedestrian-oriented streetscape enhancements are proposed to extend to Third Street.

Waterwall
A proposed waterwall would elevate an otherwise blank flood wall to interactive canvas of sight and sound.

3 Food Trucks


Food trucks located at the Greenup terminus draw the lunch crowd down to the river or serve patrons of civic events with views of the Cincinnati skyline.

Roundabout Feature
The proposed roundabout feature captures the story of the city's relationship with the river with a composition of stone, vegetation, and sculpture.

Relocated Roebling Statue



1 Riverfront Bleachers
Terraced bleachers serve as a vantage point for viewing river activities, proposed digital projection on the Roebling Bridge (see below), and views of the Cincinnati skyline. Vendor stations could be integrated into the bleachers to serve visitors.


Grand Stairs with Canopy
Grand civic steps connect the bridge and elevated promenade (see Mural Terrace Overlay) to the river, converging beneath the Roebling Bridge. A canopy shelters the landing and bleachers, feathering out toward the river to reveal the beauty of the iconic bridge structure.



3 Kayak Flume
The bands shadowing the cables of the suspension bridge provide a playful opportunity to launch kayaks into the river.

Digital Projection
The bridge piers becomes a canvas where digital projections tell the story of the riverfront and can be viewed from the bleachers.





1 Elevated Promenade

An elevated promenade engages second and third floor tenants in the RiverCenter and connect pedestrians to a broader recreation trail network along the river. The underside of the promenade houses sound and light infrastructure - above the floodplain - for the civic plaza below.

Paving Mosaic

Paving mosaic would embellish the plaza and introduce a layer of interpretive storytelling related to the influence of the river on the evolution of Covington.

3 Sculptural Canopy


An overhead canopy provides shade and houses sound and light infrastructure - above the floodplain - to support events that occur at the plaza. The canopy is light and airy to create a sense of enclosure without competing with the flood wall murals.

Interactive Water Feature

Misters attached to the canopies would attract families to the riverfront to cool off.

Streetscape Enhancements

Streetscape enhancements, including street trees, site furnishings, and a canopy of lights, extends from Fourth Street to the Madison Terminus at the river.

CityView Gateway

The flood gate and elevated promenade frame a view of the Cincinnati skyline and have an opportunity to become a lighted gateway into the city of Covington. The gateway is also an automated flood gate and includes restrooms.

Waterfall


A waterfall cascades from the Madison Avenue terminus into the Ohio River. The waterfall is framed by a contemporary riparian landscape meant to draw visitors to the river and create an attractive "front yard" to the city.

Dramatic Water Feature

Dramatic plumes of water create sound and spectacle. The debris deflector is also an opportunity to introduce an artful element that responds to every-changing river conditions.

1 Boat / Water Taxi Landing

A loading/unloading dock provides convenient access to Madison Avenue from the riverfront.

Eco-District

The Greenest Neighborhood in the Region! The Eco-District provides modern accommodations for a growing population who enjoy the benefits healthy living in an urban environment. A re-densified urban edge surrounds an enlarged riverfront green.



3 Riverfront Green

A robust trail network connects riverfront amenities to provide a circuit of recreational activities for all types of visitors. The riparian edge serves as a functional ecological and flood control buffer.

Family Waterfront Recreation Hub

Focused on family recreation, the Bakewell Street Terminus hosts a spectrum of active recreational activities using the former Waterfront site and underside of the overpass. It also bookends the propose future riverfront development.
